Space Shuttle operations are the main focus at **Launch Complex 39 Observation Gantry**. First, check out the briefing film and interactive exhibit area. Then go straight to the top for a 360° view of the launch pads, the crawler-way and the Vehicle Assembly Building.

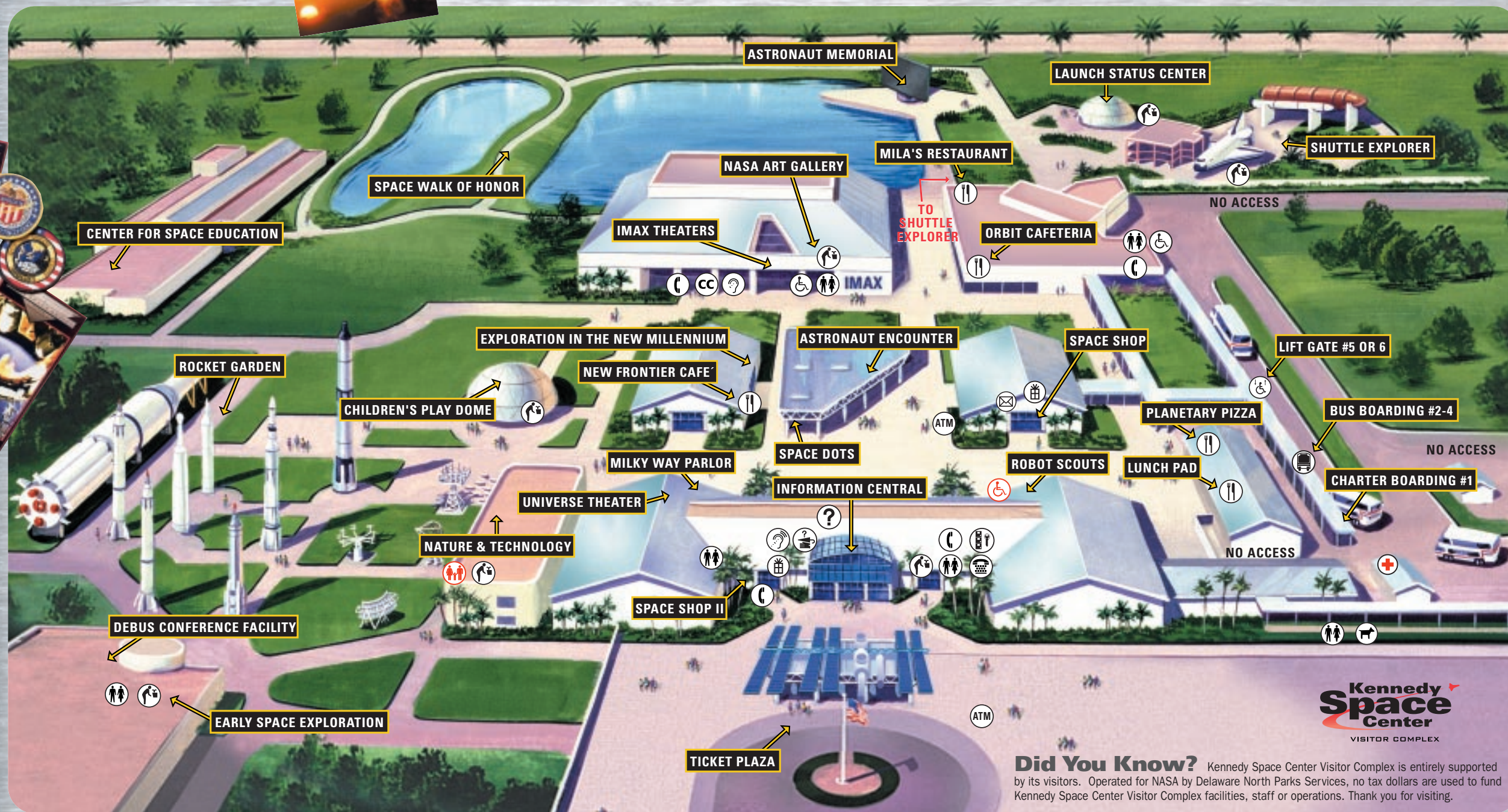
